REPORT ON THE FEDERATION DELEGATES' MEETING - 20th MAY 2017.

The Delegates Meeting was hosted by the Antique Car Club Albury-Wodonga Inc. at the Albury Entertainment Centre, situated right in the centre of the very busy city of Albury.

Our Club was represented by Delegates Tony Pettigrew and Bill Allen, accompanied by their wives Maxine and Terri. After an excellent lunch, provided by the caterers of the Entertainment Centre, we caught up with several of our old friends. The meeting was held in impressive theatre situated on the first floor.

Federation President, Neil Athorn welcomed the 80 or so Delegates (down from the expected 140 to 150); and introduced John Sherman of the Host Club. John advised that as this weekend was the fiftieth anniversary of the Club many of the Members were on a Rally. Unfortunately John's 1930's Dodge Ute was the only Club vehicle on display and then only for a very short time.


The Club was formed fifty years ago with about 45 members with 30 members having pre-1920 vehicles. The Club now has 117 family members with around one third having pre-1930 vehicles and fifty percent being Pre 1950 models. Surprisingly participation in Club events is greater with the earlier models.

The current Rally has attracted 350 to 400 vehicles. Many were from New South Wales. John welcomed Delegates to Albury-Wodonga advising that this was the first time the Federation has held a meeting here.

The following are some interesting points raised at the meeting:-

- Treasurer, Brett Holloway, advised that Subscription Renewals had been sent out and to date 120 Clubs had renewed, leaving 28 not yet renewed. Brett then read out the non financial Clubs; fortunately we were not included
- The Annual Picnic at Marong will be held on 21st August 2018. Federation Club Members are requested to bring their Newsletter showing this Event otherwise non Member Club entrants will be charged \$20.00 entry fee. Once again entrants will need to be in by 10.30am and will not be able to leave before 2.30pm. Vehicles participating in the Golden Oldies Tour will depart at 2.15pm.
- The proposed Maffra Tour, scheduled to take place a week before the Bendigo Swap in a bit "up in the air" at the moment as the organiser has resigned.
- The Scoresby Picnic did not take place this year due to inclement weather and will not be rescheduled this year. It will next be held on the 8th April 2018.
- The Australia Day Display in Kings Domain has not been finalised for next year as no correspondence has been received from the Department of Premier and Cabinet. John Kennett, the organiser, advised numbers are expect to be tight as per last year.
- It has been reported that some vehicles, under twenty five years old, have been put on the Club Permit Scheme. Delegates were reminded that it is the Club's responsibility to ensure that this does not occur.
- The Australian Historic Motoring Federation - the Australian wide organisation representing all State groups, is planning a National Tour in the Albury-Wodonga area from 28th March 2020 to 4th April 2020. This will be the first National Open Rally since the Shannon's 2001 Rally to Canberra.
- Due to the success of the first Bendigo Swap Meeting (solely for tractors and associated parts) it is proposed to hold another event on the 28th to 29th April 2018. It will be promoted in Fed News.
- There was some discussion on CPS vehicles being used to transport goods for sale to swap meetings. It was suggested that interested parties, namely VicRoads, the Police and the Taxation Department were currently "turning a blind eye" to this practice. However those doing this need to be on guard.
- Rules concerning Roadworthy Certificates for Motorcycles, eligible for CPS, have not yet been finalised by VicRoads.
- Progress with this year's Bendigo Swap Meeting is doing well. The Federation has now become a Member of the Agricultural Society at a cost of \$2,500.00 per year. However, as a Member of this Society their Public Risk Insurance for the Swap Meeting will reduce by \$10,000.00. As a result of this association, all entrants to the Swap Meeting will be given a printed ticket.
- There has been considerable positive feed back from the RACV "100 Years for Women Drivers" event.
- There was considerable discussion on running events which the public may attend, ranging from Working with Children Permits to WorkCover and necessary permits from Councils etc. Ignorance of such requirements is no excuse - especially in the Coroner's Court!
- The Federation cannot arrange "blanket insurance" as it is not an insurance broker.
- All converted Motor Homes must be on "M" plates not "H" plates.
- As the meeting finished slightly ahead of time, President Neil enquired if there were any questions. This resulted in the usual barrage of somewhat ill informed questions about the CPS Scheme.
