
## Flyer for REX'S BIG DAY OUT - Limited numbers (Fully Booked Event)

At this time on the 12th March Victoria had recorded no new cases of coronavirus (COVID-19). This was the 14th day in a row that Victoria had recorded no locally acquired new cases of COVID-19. The timing was right, it was great to get 'Back on the road again' to enjoy the big backyard, our destination was north west regional town of Bendigo, we started our catch up with our ABCCC friends at Kyneton, lunch was a good start at the Shamrock Hotel, of course we were all still mindful of Covid rules.





After lunch we headed off to Bendigo, some stayed on in Kyneton and ventured into Piper St shops, the Antique Shop was a popular spot.

In Bendigo after finding a car spot, some members attended the Chinese Dragon Museum. The wonderful dragons, processional regalia, stunning textiles and other treasures were amazing.

The Victorian Gold Rush saw thousands of Chinese migrate to Bendigo in the latter half of the 19th Century. They were seeking better opportunities for themselves and their families. The large and significant collection of Chinese processional regalia dating back to 1880s forms part the museum. The museum also contains displays which show the hardships and racism many Chinese faced because of the White Australia policy at the beginning of the 20th century. Alongside these specific displays the assorted Chinese artifacts are great examples of Chinese culture and history, which has significantly grown and preserves the history of the Chinese in Bendigo. Bendigo is still known today as 'Dai Gum San' or 'Big Gold Mountain' by the Chinese.



Friday night we all meet up at the Bendigo RSL for dinner, a few that came straight to Bendigo joined us here. George & Lorraine from Tocumwal along with Howard & Wendy Hutchins who are now living in Maldon it was great to catch up with them, that was the complete group.

On Saturday morning thanks to John & Virginia Rowe for arranging us to meet up at the clubrooms of the Veteran, Vintage & Classic Club Bendigo. Great display of cars and morning tea was fantastic. The VVCCB club rooms were great, everyone had a chance to look around and opportunity to look at our cars and also club member's cars. Tony presented a small plague of our appreciation.













The rest of Saturday was our free day to take the time to look around Bendigo and surrounds at our leisure Greg & Geraldine went out to visit to "The Great Stupa of Universal Compassion" at Myers Flat. Greg wrote: The Stupa is the same design and size as "The Great Stupa of Gyantse in Tibet and is the largest in the Western World rising to a height of 48m from the base of 50m and it is still under construction.

The approach to The Stupa is flanked by the Peace Park Inter-Faith Gardens with a self-guided walking trail that featured the Golden Thai Buddha, Quan Yin a manifestation of Chenrezig, The Buddha of Compassion and many carved representations of Buddha and other religious icons of numerous faiths and it was amazing to view despite the pouring rain.

The Prayer Wheels around the outside of The Stupa were all made in Nepal and are painted gold and bear the compassion mantra "Om Mani Padme Hum"

Inside The Stupa is the largest Jade Buddha in the world at 2.5m high and weighing 4 tonne. There are numerous representations of Buddha and many holy relics & artifacts & artworks as well as a Mountain Horn that was played.

The Visitor Centre had a video presentation about The Stupa, a café and gift shop with a large range of merchandise.
