ABCCC is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS)

The ABCCC has set rules & conditions for operating a motor vehicle [twenty-five (25) years old and older on the CPS, For further information about how the CPS is conducted by the All British Classics Car Club please visit the club's Website Link ABCCC Club Permit Scheme information

- 1. Initial contact should be made with the club's Vehicle Logbook Club Permit Scheme (VLCPS) Applications Officer, currently Wally Thompson. He will advise the procedure for application with respect to the conditions set by the ABCCC. He must also provide a first inspection of the vehicle.
- 2. PERMIT RENEWALS VicRoads requires that an ABCCC authorised VLCPS Officer's signature is entered on the permit renewal notice. Therefore, your VLCPS renewal should be sent to Colin Brown, PO Box 40, Coldstream, Victoria 3770. Enclose with it a stamped envelope addressed to VicRoads, along with a cheque/money order for the VLCPS fee. Colin will sign on behalf of the ABCCC, and then forward the permit renewal on to VicRoads. The form also requires YOUR signature, so be sure to sign it as the permit holder as well.

Both Wally & Colin's position are entirely voluntary, so due consideration should be given when contacting them.

FROM THE FEDERATION Department Of Transport Victorian Club Permit Scheme Review.

The Department Of Transport (D.O.T.) have concerns that the word Domestic means that a VCPS Vehicle can be used for Weddings, Work or any trip not in keeping with Club Events. Restrict to Club Activity, Club sanctioned event or Test Drive of CPS Vehicle only must be within the VCPS System. Horse floats are being towed by VCPS Vehicles to non club events.

Discussion from the floor about vehicle use within clubs, current VCPS use of vehicles for enterprise, with members suggesting that D.O.T. look at Member Clubs' executive committees who approve vehicles for the VCPS system and only be available for legitimate registered clubs.

Damian O'Doherty replied to D.O.T. AOMC and Federation expressing that he was against the word 'Domestic' being removed from Federation's Proposal, his individual comments on costings calculated on full days for VCPS as against full registration of a Vehicle.

Neil Athorn (Federation President) noted that individual comments will be accepted in March by D.O.T.

Neil spoke of vehicles being kept in an acceptable safe condition with members looking after vehicles for use, so therefore the word 'Domestic' should be changed to 'Private' use in the proposal.

Neil spoke about all issues being aired and documented on record for the review going forward and enhancing the movement for club activities.

Christine McCarthy (Mildura Vintage Vehicles Club) spoke in agreeance that the word 'Private' be included as against the word 'Domestic'.

Neil thanked the seven clubs out of over one hundred member clubs who responded to the D.O.T. VCPS review.

When Glenda decided to add the MGBs pictured in front of the Rochester Silos to this issues front cover, I thought it would be good to add some information about MGBs in Australia. Knowing that MGBs were manufactured by British Motor Company (BMC) who later were known in Australia as Leyland, but actually finding information on the MGBs manufacturing in Australia was a bit harder than I thought. There is lots of reading on the British information.

The best source was the www.mgcc.com.au. There is another website that is trying to get information that is www.mgbsmadeinaustralia.org. It was then interesting to read the reason why I was finding it so hard to source information. It was stated that this was due to the fact that when the plant at Zetland NSW was closed, management ordered the disposal of all production records into large industrial waste bins. With the exception of a couple of staff who had the foresight to retrieve what they could, everything was lost. Since then, everybody has been reliant on the memory of others to resolve production details. Unfortunately, there has never been one place where all this knowledge has been gathered and available to everyone.

What is known is that the MGB was delivered to Australia in "Completely Knocked Down" (CKD) form to be assembled by BMC Australia at a plant in Zetland, NSW MGB production commenced in Australia on 4 April 1963 and ceased on 6 November 1972. One reason why local production ceased is that legislation that came into effect in 1972 required that cars have 85% local content in order to avoid duty, and the MGB had less than 50% local content.

The MGB in Australia



When they arrived in Australia, the

cars were not painted and had no trim or hoods. Until 1969 the heater was an optional extra. However, many other items that were optional extras in other markets were included as standard in Australia.

Local content is reported to have been as high as 45% in some years and included locally produced hoods, trim, glass, tyres and seats. The seats were supposed to be an improvement on the English seats but were made of vinyl instead of leather.

Now the Famed British brand MG has returned to Australia as Chinese parent company SAIC Motor "focusing on strengthening connections between the Australian and Chinese auto industries"

Are you keeping informed?

Updated road rules to make passing bicycle riders safer - 26 April 2021

From 26 April, when drivers pass a bicycle rider, they must leave a space of at least 1 metre between your vehicle and the rider on roads with speed limits up to 60km/h.

If drivers are travelling on roads with speed limits over 60km/h, they must leave a bigger space of at least 1.5 metres between your vehicle and the bicycle rider.

The minimum passing distance is measured from the widest part of the combination of vehicle and trailer being towed.

If drivers cannot pass the bicycle rider safely, they need to slow down and wait until the next safe opportunity to do so.



For large vehicles such as when towing boats, horse floats, caravans and 'tradie' trailers, as well as heavy vehicles, such as trucks and buses, a safe distance may be more than the 1m or 1.5m minimum. Therefore, drivers may need to slow down, sit behind and wait for a safe place to pass.

Be patient and keep your distance from people who ride bicycles.



On these tours we all had the great pleasure to meet John and his wife, Sonia, we were lucky enough to have had a very personal tour of John's work that was on display throughout the grounds of their property. He was very passionate about his birds (Macaw parrots).

John Piccoli story is one of a very humble man who was very proud of his family and his work. John would share his very personal life story on how he contracted polio at the age of eight, spending three years in hospital, he was confined to a wheelchair for the rest of his life. Despite his physical constraints, he successfully farmed his family's third-generation property until retiring and embarking on artistic adventures. His workshop was full of spanners, which he started to collect from clearance sales, once everyone knew of how he would use the spanners they started coming in droves from various ways, mostly from donations. He would then use these old tools in many forms for his most incredible sculptures. We were all amazed at John's creativity, he could visualise in his head how he was going to do it and then proceed without the use of drawings and using blocks and pulleys to manoeuvre himself. It was always a great trip to Boort & we hope the legacy John created continues.

This MG just happens to be electric......


